## ADMISSIONS

### INCOMING 9TH GRADERS APPLYING TO BMC

The application process consists of completing the Online Application and the submission of academic and health records. If your child is a student at one of our diocesan partner schools, you may authorize Bishop Moore Catholic to receive these documents directly by submitting a Request for Records Release Form to your current partner school. For those students coming from another school, please submit academic and health records from 6th, 7th and 8th grades.

If a student has a documented educational learning plan, IEP, 504-plan, or a pertinent psychological or educational evaluation, we ask that you submit these documents along with your academic and health records.

If you will be applying for a PLSA, Step-Up, or McKay Scholarship, please submit a copy of your student's Social Security Card.

# Tuition and Financial Aid

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Bishop Moore Catholic High School prides itself on being one of the most affordable private high schools in the Orlando area. We want to remain accessible to working families and all those interested in an excellent Catholic education. While we make every effort to keep the information on this page up-to-date, it is provided as a courtesy; tuition and fees are subject to change on an annual basis.

## TUITION AND FEES

As per Diocesan mandate, all tuition payments, including annual payments, are processed via FACTS management system. Only one Bishop Moore FACTS enrollment form is required per family if the same bank account and withdrawal date is used.

Catholic student (defined as being an active, supporting member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Orlando as verified by your parish) tuition is \$10,692 per year, per student.

Non-Catholic student (defined as a non-registered or non-supporting member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Orlando) tuition is \$14,772 per student, per year.

### Payment Options

#### Monthly Payments

Due July through June of the current school year:

Catholic - \$891.00

Non-Catholic - \$1231.00

#### Semester Payments

Due in July and January of the current school year (this payment option includes a \$50.00 discount per semester):

Catholic - \$5296.00

Non-Catholic - \$7336.00

#### Annual Payment

Due on or before July 1, 2017 (this payment option includes a \$200.00 discount):

Catholic - \$10,492.00

Non-Catholic - \$14,572.00

## Fees

Fees are not refundable.

## Registration

Students must register every year. The non-refundable registration fee is \$450.00. There is a \$50.00 discount if you complete registration by February 19, 2017.

## Application Processing

A one-time application fee of \$75.00 is required for all new students.

## FACTS Enrollment

This per family **annual** fee is \$36 for monthly payment plans or \$10 for semester payment plans. FACTS automatically adds this fee to your tuition bill. If you opt to pay tuition in full at registration, there is no fee associated with using FACTS.

## FINANCIAL AID

Although you are required to complete a separate Bishop Moore FACTS Tuition Enrollment form per school and/or account, we only require one FACTS Grant & Aid application per family. Be advised that your student must be registered at Bishop Moore Catholic High School and your enrollment complete to be considered for financial aid. Submitting an application does not guarantee Bishop Moore will provide financial assistance. We will notify you by mail regarding the status of your application.

### VISION

#### ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Bishop Moore offers 27 Advanced Placement (AP) courses in art, biology, calculus, chemistry, computer science, economics, English, environmental science, geography, government, history(American, European and world), Latin, music theory, physics, psychology, Spanish and statistics. Placement in these classes is based on grades, teacher recommendations, and standardized test scores. All AP students are required to sit for the AP exams in order to receive AP credit. The Bishop Moore Catholic High School percent of total AP students with a passing score of 3+ was 77.4% for 2016-2017 school year.
